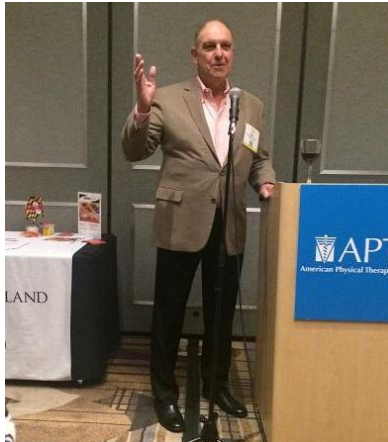

Impairment-Based Treatment offers rehab professionals a structured framework to produce maximally effective treatment interventions. Rehab professionals are increasingly having to do more within a shorter timeframe. We need to be more effective and precise in our assessment and treatment prescription. The ICF Model will be examined and the participants will learn to tease out impairments which limit function and how to develop treatment interventions to address these impairments. Participants will learn how to hypothesize, test hypothesis, and prioritize impairments to promote more effective treatment interventions. Selection of appropriate tests and measures is reviewed. Extensive afternoon lab section designed to introduce use of common household and clinic items in their design to add fun and interest to their programs. This is not specifically ortho- or neuro-focused, but instead uses a wide variety of case examples to highlight the problem solving process for any diagnosis with examples tailored to the needs of the facility.
