On Friday, March 11th, 2016, the CAPTE Task Force successfully submitted the Self-Study report to the Commission on Accreditation in Physical Therapy Education (CAPTE). CAPTE is the accrediting agency that is nationally recognized by the US Department of Education (USDE) and the Council for Higher Education Accreditation (CHEA). CAPTE grants specialized accreditation status to qualified entry-level education programs for physical therapists and physical therapist assistants.
