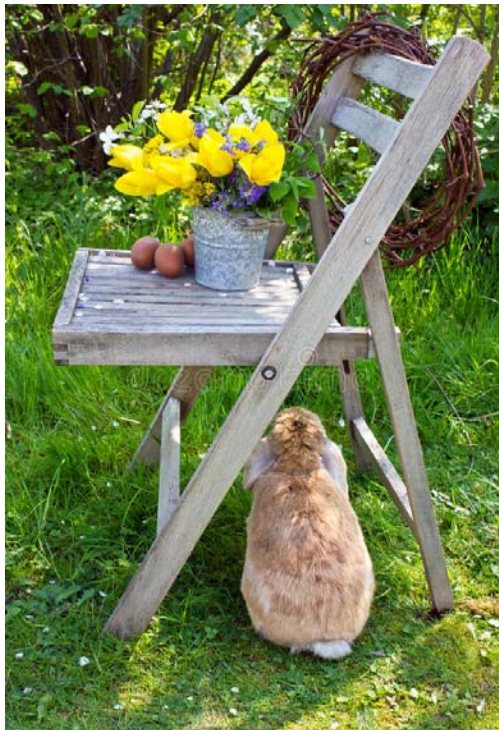

Advocacy Day

On Wednesday, February 14th, 2018, students from the Class of 2019 and Class of 2020, along with several faculty members, participated in the American Physical Therapy Association of Maryland's Advocacy Day in Annapolis. There were approximately 200 PTs, PTAs, and PT/OTA students lobbying in the Maryland House and Senate. Students lobbied for/against several bills that would impact the PT profession. Due to their efforts, SB151/HB497 (ATC revision of practice act bill) received an unfavorable report and was withdrawn by the sponsor!



UMB Interprofessional Fair

Jon Hermansen, Kaitlin Bielec, and Aanchal Domalapally (UMB SOM PTRS Class of 2020) and Dr. **Vincent Conroy, PT, DScPT** (faculty mentor) were invited to represent the physical therapy program at the UMB Interprofessional Fair on March 10, 2018 held at the School of Pharmacy. This fair provided middle and high school students from Baltimore City an opportunity to meet an interprofessional team of graduate students [School of Dentistry, School of Nursing, School of Social Work, School of Law, School of Pharmacy and School of Medicine (Med and PT)] to discuss potential career choices. The first year PT students answered questions and shared exciting information about the career of physical therapy. Participants also engaged in interactive elements such as listening to their own heartbeats through dual-headed stethoscopes and observing a wrist move into extension by electrical current generated from an e-stim machine. That definitely got some cheers!"



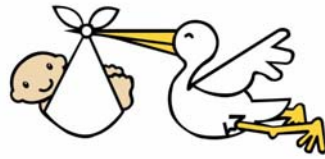
UMB Wellness Fair

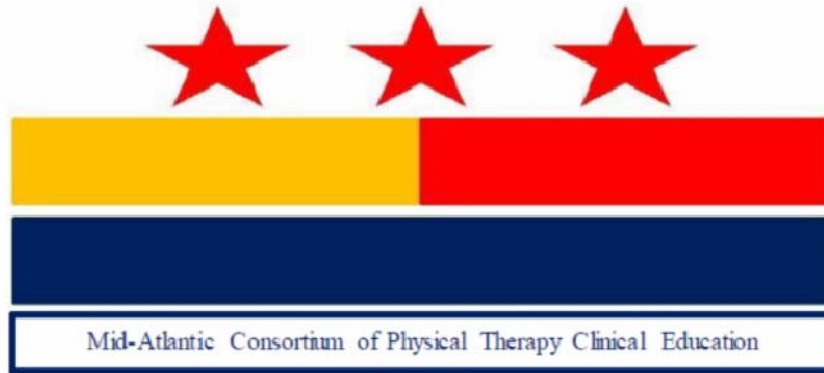

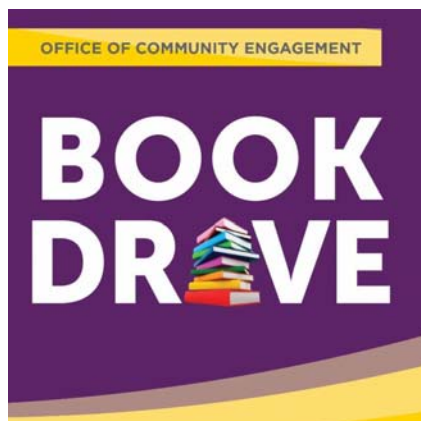
