Mark W. Rogers, PT, PhD, FAPTA, Professor and Chair, has been awarded funding from the Maryland Higher Education Commission for the Health Personnel Shortage Incentive Grant (HPSIG). The HPSIG is funded by a percentage of physicians' fees collected annually by the Maryland Board of Physicians. These funds are distribution to post-secondary institutions to enhance or expand approved academic programs in health occupations experiencing personnel shortages in Maryland. The award is a one year grant in the amount of \$45,000.
