Anatomy of Sports

The annual Anatomy of Sports at the Medical Museum was held on Saturday, August 11th, 2018 at the National Museum of Health and Medicine. The event featured athletes from a variety of sports that included: kayaking, running, football, field events (shot put and discus), speed skating, curling, yoga and equestrian (both horse and rider). Medical Illustrators were on hand to highlight anatomical structures utilized in the performance of these activities via illustration techniques using a variety of water based media. Members of the Uniformed Services University Medical School were also present and displayed anatomical models to assist participants with their understanding of anatomical structures and their relationship with movement. PTRS Students from the **Classes of 2020** and **2021** provided assistance to the illustrators and engaged with more than 200 members of the general public attending the event. The students answered questions about the various illustrated structures, commented on the structures' relationship in performing each sport, provided information



regarding conditioning and injury prevention and offered insight into post injury rehabilitation. The students also provided general information regarding the role physical therapy can play in assisting the athlete.
