Roy Film, PT, DPT, OCS, FAAOMPT, has been awarded funding by the Interprofessional Faculty Development Institute as a co-investigator on: "A Better Way to Manage Pain: An Interprofessional Student Symposium on Pain Management and Mitigating Risk for Opioid Misuse and Addiction."
