



## 2016 Admission Checklist

- 1. Select **ONE** of the following options.
  - A. To *ACCEPT* the offer of admission, please **submit the Enrollment Form** included in your packet. Accepting the offer of admission requires that you submit a *\$500 non-refundable deposit*. From your deposit \$400 will be applied toward DPT tuition and \$100 will be applied toward the Enrollment Fee. <a href="http://www.umaryland.edu/media/umb/af/sa/mpt.pdf">http://www.umaryland.edu/media/umb/af/sa/mpt.pdf</a>. Your deadline for accepting the offer of admission and submitting the deposit is noted on the Enrollment Form.
    - **IMPORTANT NOTE**: After accepting the offer of admission and submitting the \$500 non-refundable deposit, this department will regularly monitor the PTCAS Competing Offers Accepted List. If your name appears on this list, it confirms that you have accepted the offer of admission at another DPT program. In this case, your offer of admission to PTRS will be revoked and your space in the enter class will be cancelled.
  - B. To **DEFER** your response to the offer of admission, please **submit the Defer Response Form.** If you are not able to respond to the offer of admission by the required deadline, you may opt to place your name on the Defer Response Waiting List for Enrollment. Being placed on the Waiting List does not guarantee that space to enroll in the entering class will ultimately be available. **Your deadline for selecting the option to defer your response to the offer of admission is noted on the Defer Response Form**.

The demands placed on the student during their time in the curriculum correspond to the expectations of entry-level physical therapists. These demands encompass the following areas: observational, communicative, psychomotor, cognitive and affective behavioral skills.

- 10. **CPR and First Aid**: Provide upon enrollment.
  - CPR certification must include infant, child and adult resuscitation.
  - Courses delivered solely via a web-based format ARE NOT acceptable.
  - "Blended" format courses are acceptable: on-line instruction and in-person skills practice and testing.

Certifications must be valid on the first day of class and must remain active throughout your enrollment in the DPT program.
