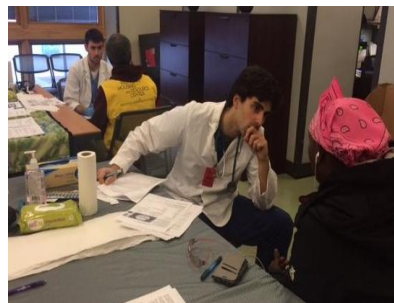
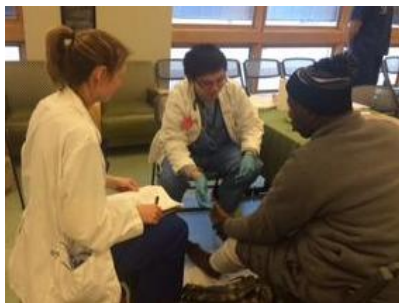

Interprofessional Funding Opportunities



IPE FACULTY AWARDS

The purpose of the Faculty Award in Support of Interprofessional Education (IPE) is to encourage and build a community of faculty members across the schools of the University of Maryland, Baltimore (UMB) and throughout the University System of Maryland who have interest and expertise in interprofessional education. This includes, potentially, IPE activities nationally and internationally. All University of Maryland, Baltimore faculty members are eligible to apply for a Faculty Award of up to \$2,000 annually. Other faculty from the University System of Maryland require a partner from the UMB faculty and are eligible for up to a \$1,000 award. A two-page proposal, including a budget, should be submitted via email to the Center for Interprofessional Education. Deadline for priority decision: ****TODAY** Wednesday, January 27, 2016**. Additional applications will be considered on a bi-monthly basis (March, May July 2016) pending availability of funds.

SEED GRANTS

The Center for Interprofessional Education at the University of Maryland, Baltimore is pleased to announce an opportunity for \$5,000-\$10,000 seed grants for 13-month IPE and IPC pilot projects. Proposals should be practice or classroom focused, with educational and evaluative components employing the IPEC Core Competencies for Interprofessional Collaborative Practice. Grant funds may not be used toward salary or benefit support. The deadline for proposals is **Friday, February 12, 2016**.
