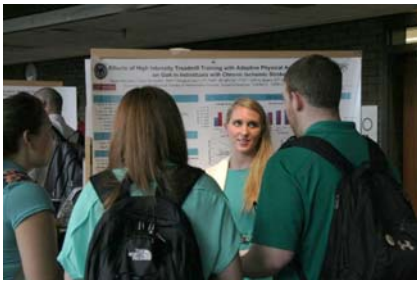

Maryland Half Marathon

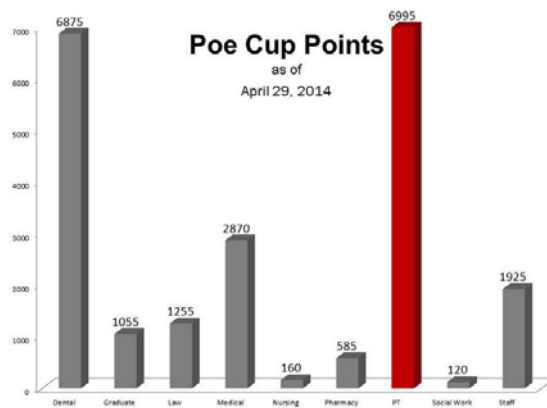
