Assistant Professor of Neurology
Co-Director of the Brain, Learning,
and Movement (BLAM) Lab
Johns Hopkins University

Dr. Haith's research seeks to develop and test theories about how the brain makes decisions and controls movement of the body, and how it learns to improve these capabilities through experience. He received his undergraduate degree from Cambridge University (Sidney Sussex College) in Mathematics and Computer Science, MSc in Machine Learning/Informatics from the University of Edinburgh, and PhD under Dr. Sethu Vijayakumar. He then worked as a postdoctoral fellow with Dr. Reza Shadmehr and then in the BLAM Lab under Dr. John Krakauer.
