DPT CLASS OF 2014 UPDATE



All 54 graduates from the DPT Class of 2014 have now taken the NPTE. Twenty members of the class students passed the exam in April, prior to graduation and 34 students took the exam in July. The pass rate for the class is 96.30%, exceeding the national average of 92.36%.

A minimum scaled score of 600 is required to pass the licensing exam (NPTE). One student scored a perfect 800 and one student scored a near-perfect 799. Nineteen students (35%

Grants & Contracts:

Vicki L. Gray, MPT, PhD, UMANRRT Post-doctoral Fellow has received a Mary E. Switzer Merit Fellowship Award from the National Institute on Disability and Rehabilitation Research (NIDRR). The Switzer Merit Fellowship Award is a peer-reviewed, competitive award established to provide support to qualified individuals to engage in scientific research relating to the rehabilitation of individuals with disabilities. The terms of the award are \$75,000 for 12 months. This is a highly competitive award with only five given nationally this year. Dr. Gray's research focuses on balance rehabilitation and fall prevention in people with stroke.



Dr. Gray has also recently received a two-year, \$154,000 grant from the American Heart Association for "A comparison of reactive and voluntary lateral step training to reduce falls and improve balance in persons post-stroke."
