Medicare Updates

The latest changes to the Medicare Benefit Policy Manual have been published. These changes will hopefully ease some of the burden felt by outpatient services relating to reimbursement, and may be found in Change Request 3648 published in May, 2005 and revised July 25, 2005. Significant changes reflected in this update involve removal of physician visit requirement under certain conditions, initial certification of plan of care timing requirements, allowance of delayed certifications for plans of care, and changes to definitions of 'signature' to allow written, electronic or stamp signatures.
